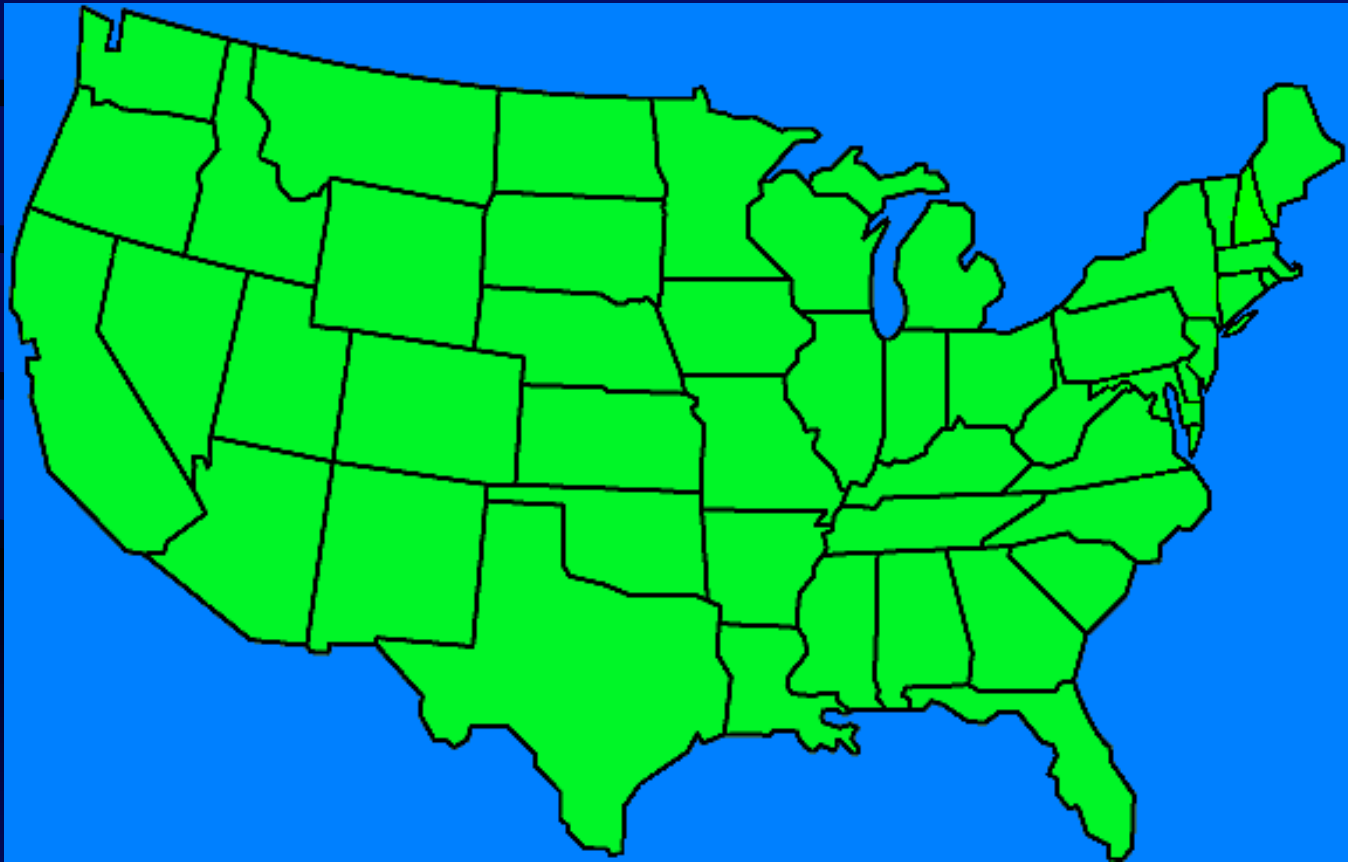

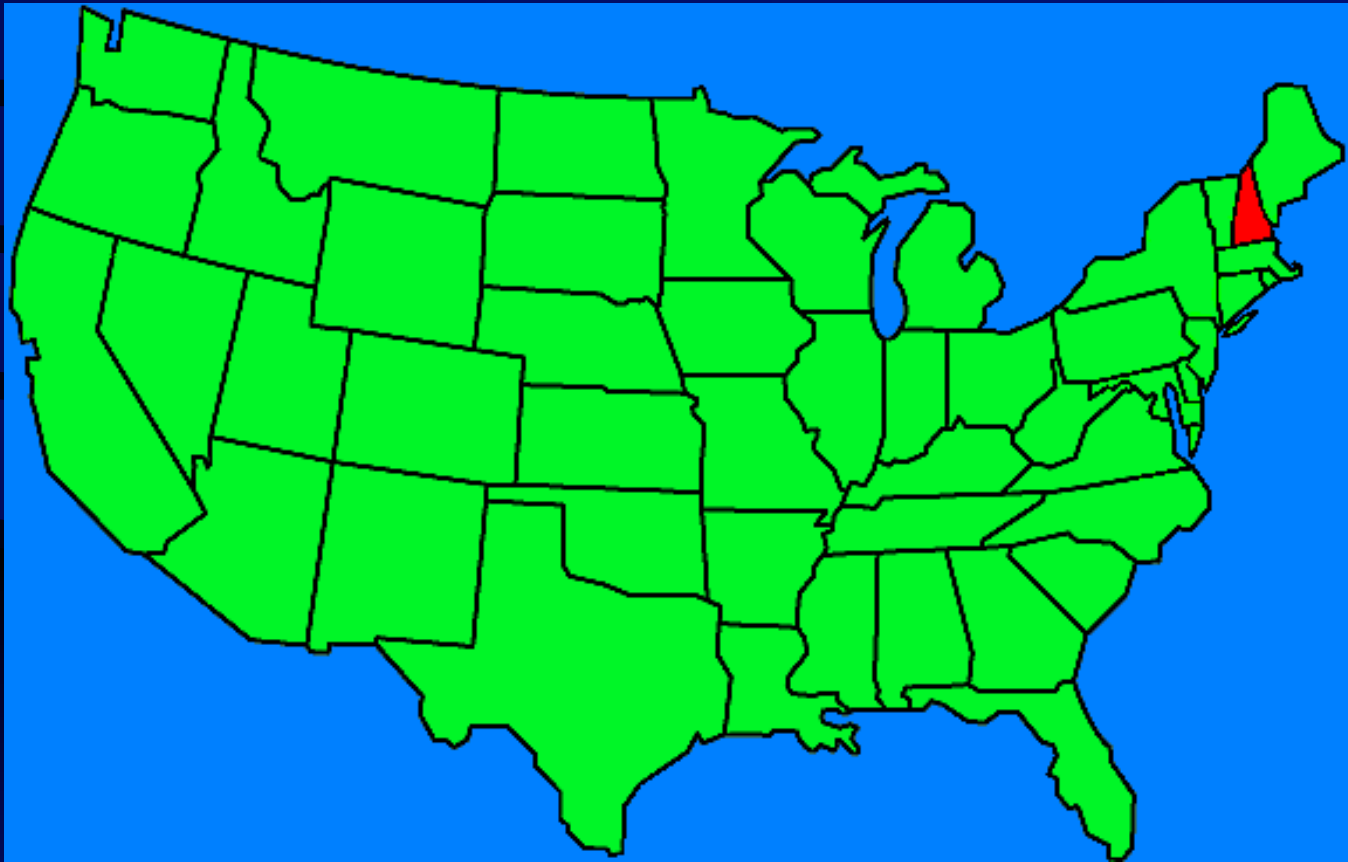

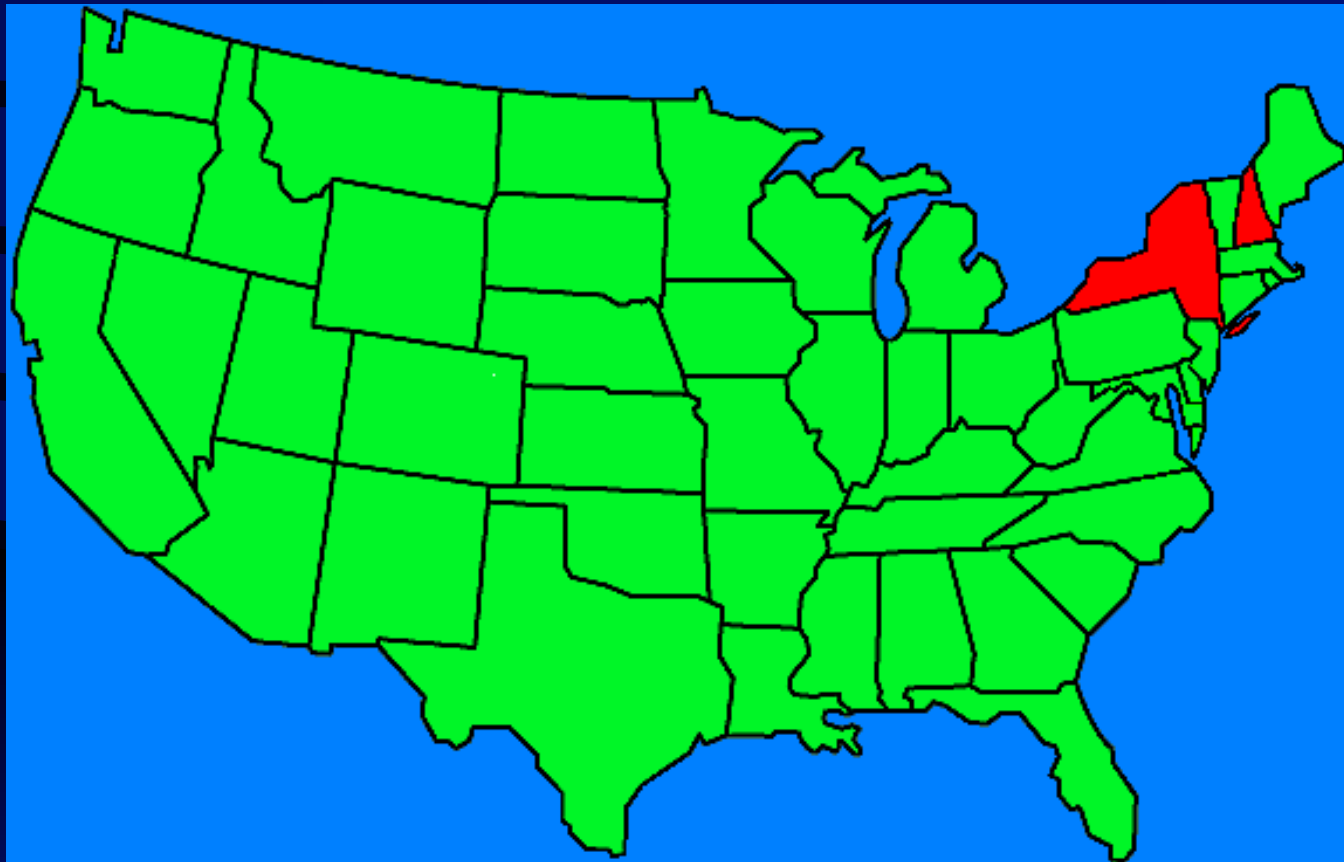


STATE LOTTERIES: 1963 - New Hampshire



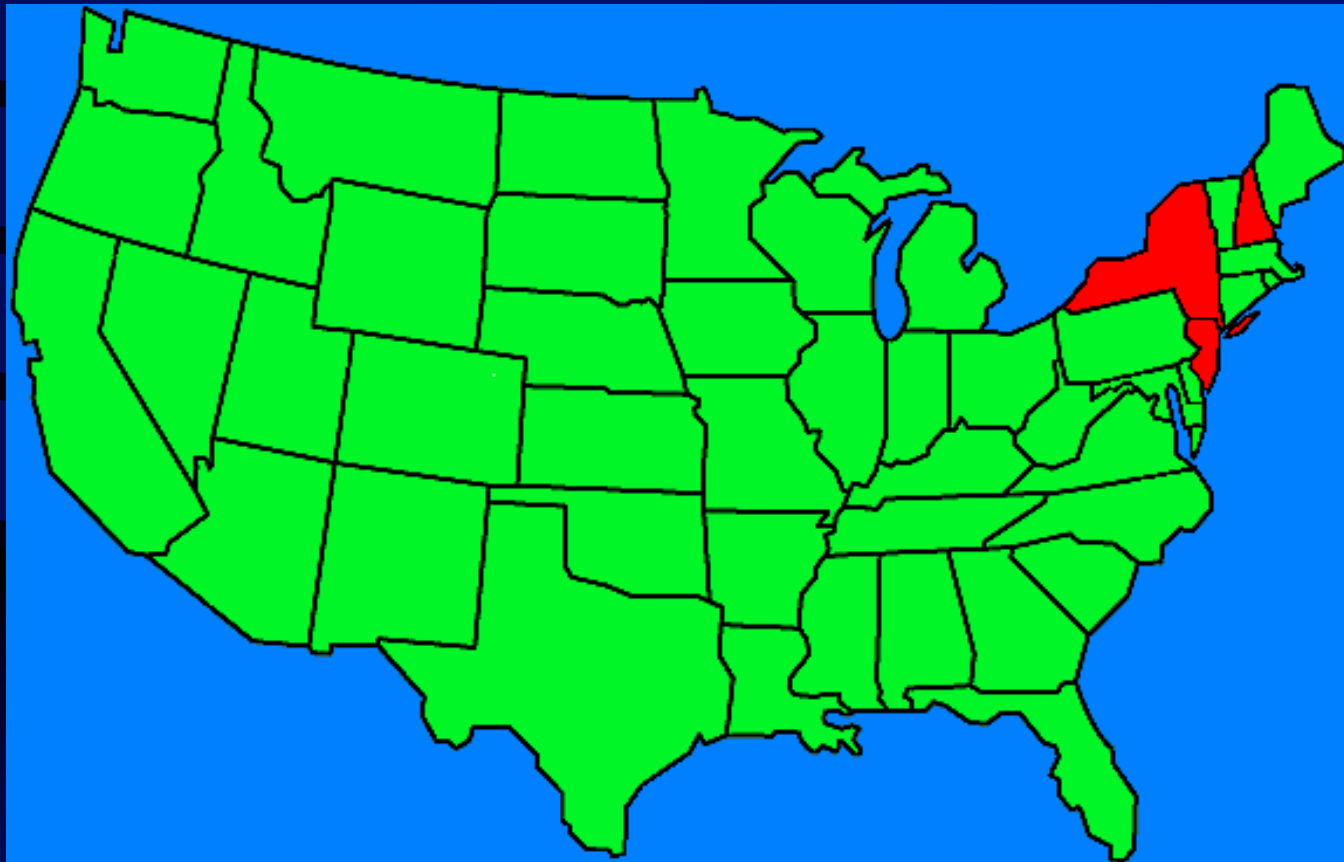

Gambling & Technology

- 18th Century First Wave – Provincial
problem: Paper lotteries, table game casino
- 19th Century Second Wave – National
problem: Mails, telegraph, telephone, resorts
- 20th Century Third Wave – Mechanical,
computers; but still (mostly) face to face
- 21st Century Fourth Wave – International
problem: Remote wagering

Most Important Hot Issue

- Bad News: Millennials hate slot machines and never carry cash
- Good News: Older patrons are living longer
- Can a business built around 19th Century games evolve to attract 21st Century players?

Hot Issues – Land Based Gaming

- Gaming as true amenity, casinos lounges with ipads for slots, sports bets
- Need to come up with new games
- Problem for regulators
- GLI monopoly
- Smoking, resort fees, using criminal justice system as debt collector, players suing casinos

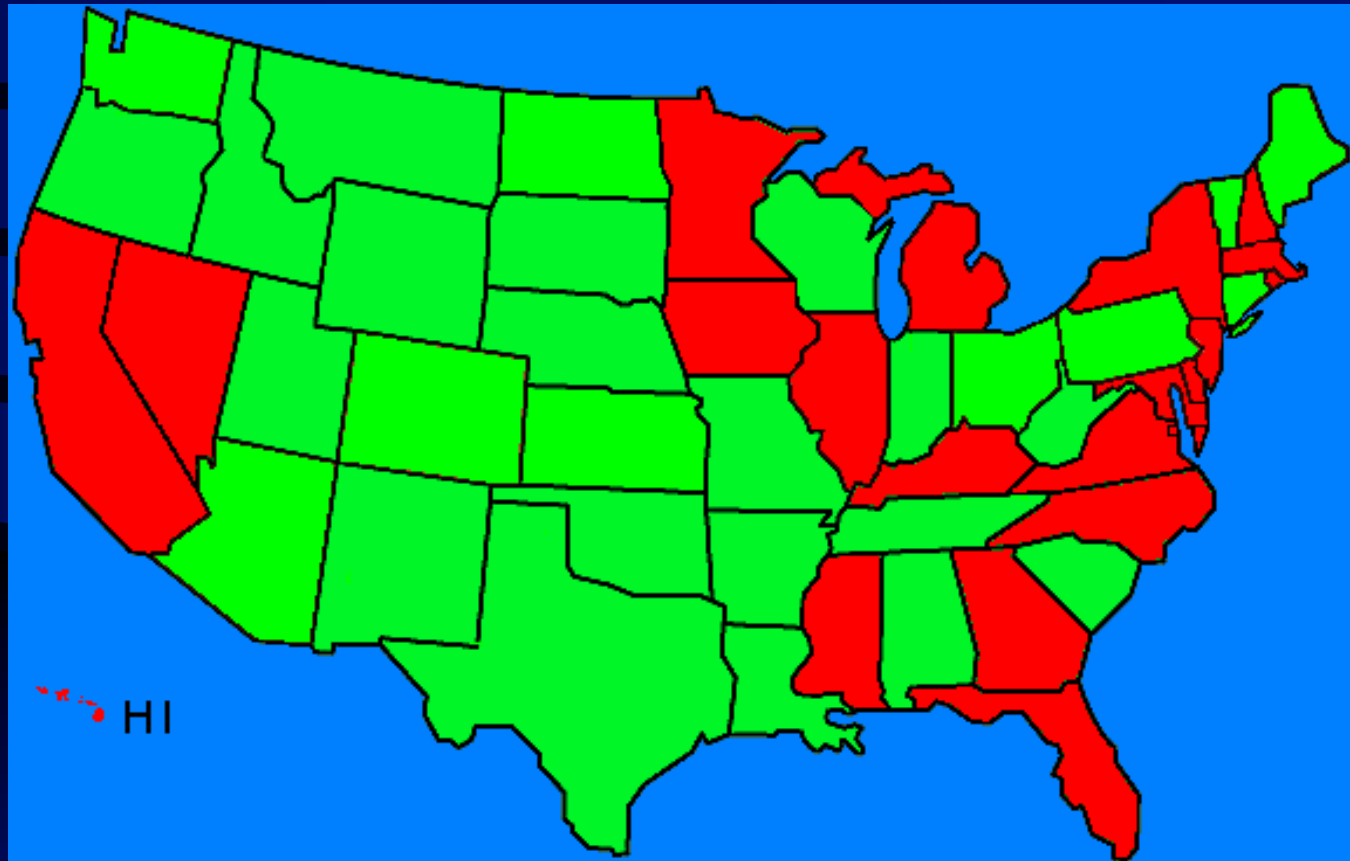
More Technology Hot Issues

- Social Casino Games – No purchase necessary, skill contests violate state laws
- Internet cafes
- Software Mistakes – \$150 million class action against Oregon Lottery

Hot Issue – Cross-Border Betting

- European model is now the standard for the world
- Original UK model did not work
- Licensing, taxation POC?
- Monopoly operators will lose their monopolies everywhere

Predictions

- Legalization depends on politics:
Government looking for revenue, Big local operators want to keep monopoly
- Nevada model does not work – too expensive, payment processing fails
- Technology is already making Internet casino games passé

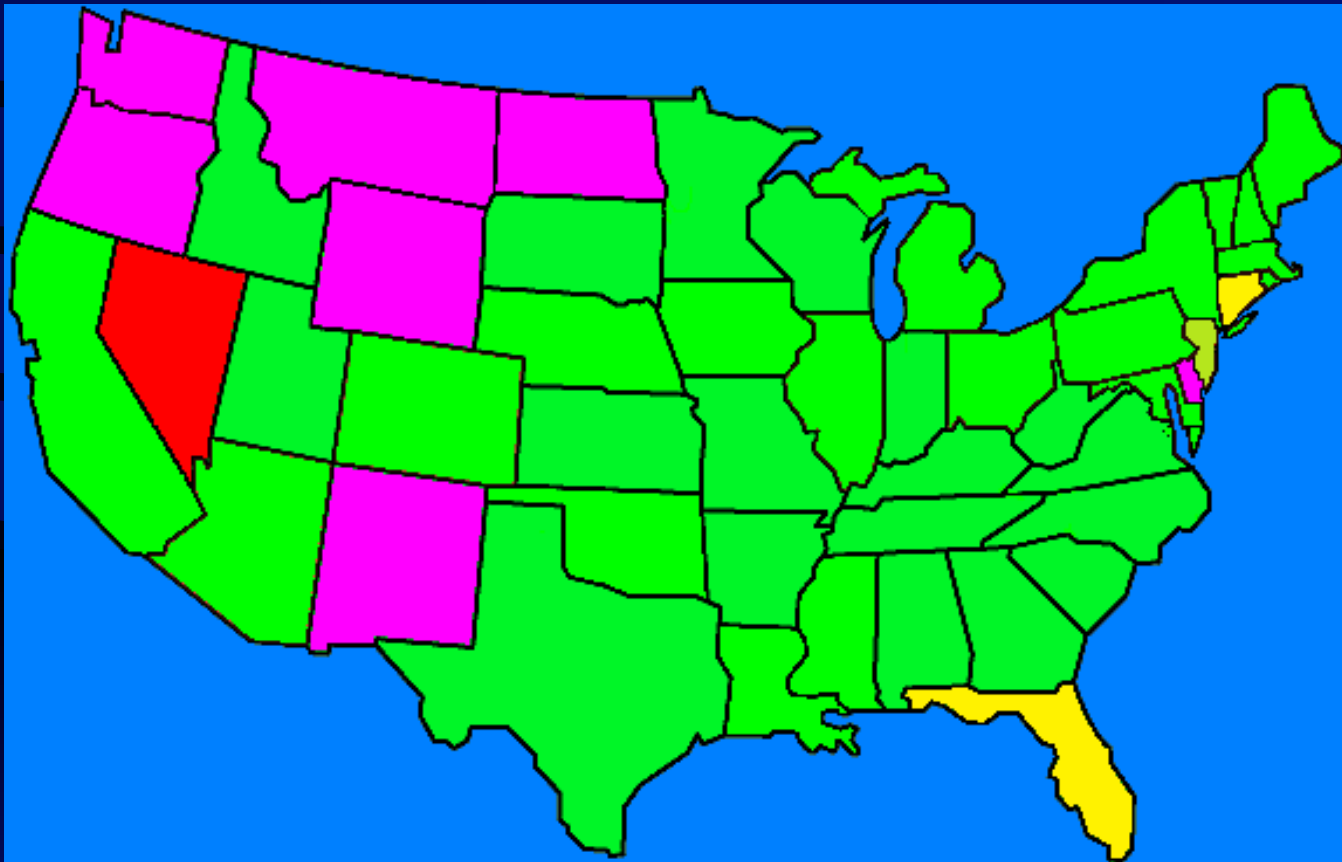
Predictions

- Congress will continue to do nothing
- Compacts among smaller states
 - Probably are constitutional
 - If not, there are ways to get around
- Bad actors laws
 - Can be constitutional
 - Depend entirely upon \$ and politics

Hot Issue – Sports Betting

- U.S. everything depends on NJ case
- Rest of the world big issue is match fixing
- In-play bets
- Fantasy sports, especially daily

More Hot Issues – Impact of Macau & China

- Numbers are so large that they warp the rest of the world, especially US & Australian companies, Asian expansion
- Baccarat in Las Vegas
- US/China Commission hearings
- FinCEN

More Hot Issues – Impact of Macau & China

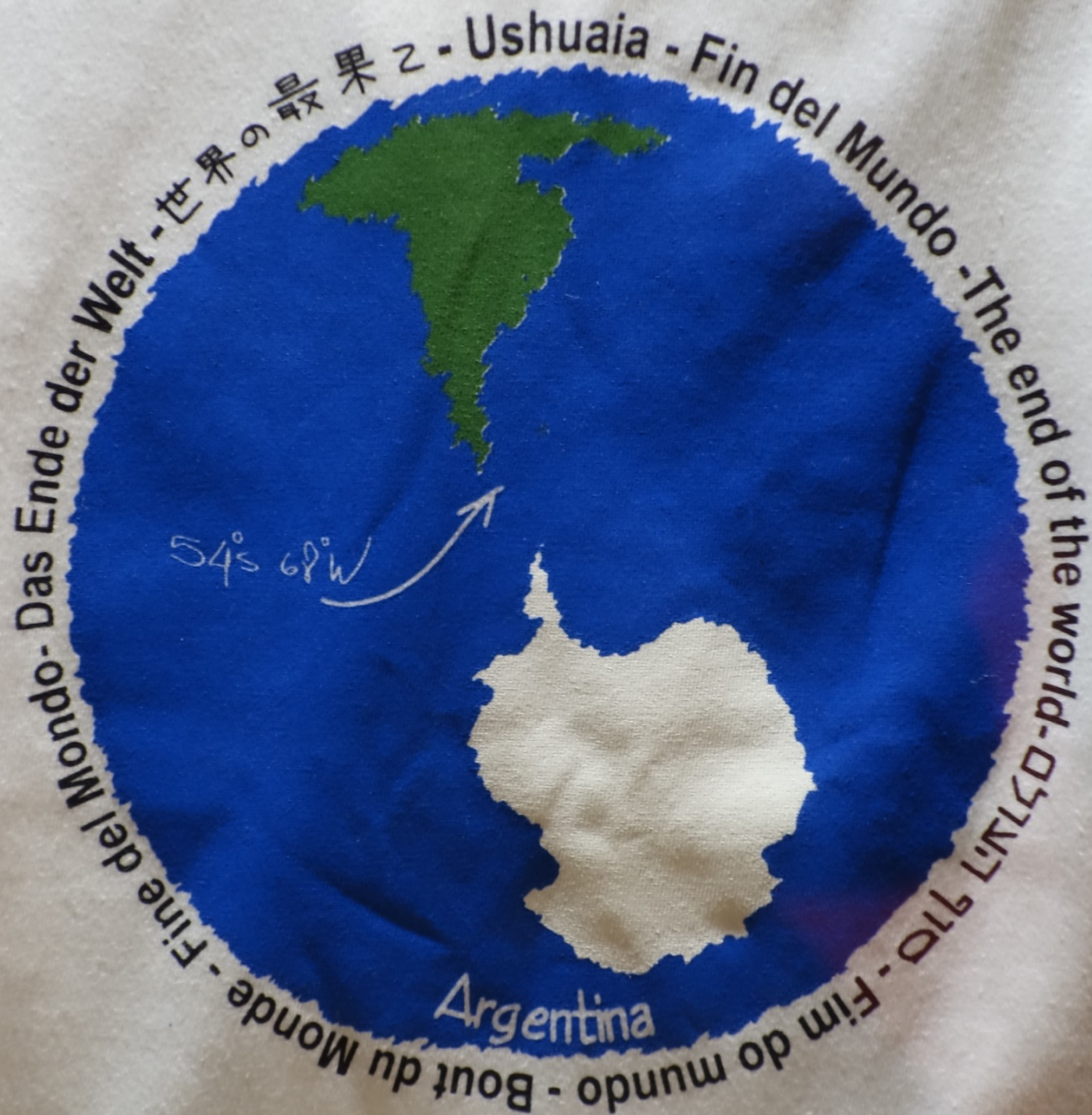
- Collectability of gambling debts in PRC
- Proxy betting
- Internet gambling in PRC
- Renewal of Concessions
- Conspiracy theories

Expansion Around the World

- Big prizes: Japan, Brazil, Venezuela, India, China
- Smaller prizes: Mexico, Thailand, Taiwan, Korea, Cuba
- State lotteries Internet explosion, instant tickets, games like Candy Crush

Predictions

- More international lotteries
 - North America? Latin America (All Spanish or Portuguese languages)?
- Spread of Class 2 and 2.5 machines
- Remote wagering on ships, planes

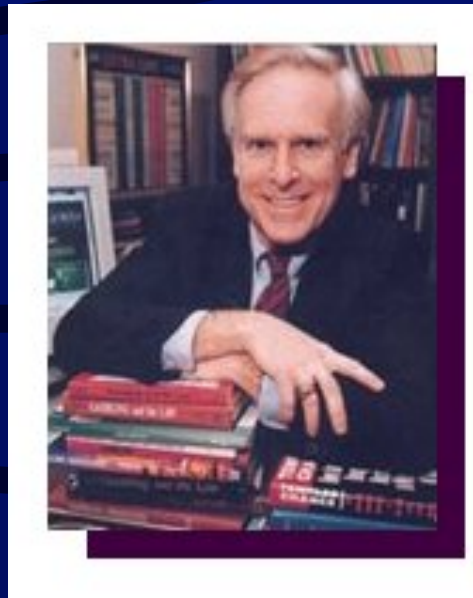
