The Three Waves Of Legal Gambling

- First Wave Colonial period to mid-19th century: Legal Debris: "Lotteries" prohibited in state constitutions and Canada (except Quebec)
- Second Wave Wild West; South after the Civil War, new inventions. Crash - Victorian morality
 Legal Debris: Statutes prohibit bookmaking, slot machines; U.S. federal and Quebec anti-lottery laws
- Third Wave Depression to present:
 Legal Debris: Piecemeal legalization by states, provinces

What is a Lottery?

- All games of prize, chance and consideration
- Has a paper ticket
- 100% chance
- Prize from a pooling of players' bets
- Government runs
- What the general public thinks
- Don't have to go to a place to play
- No player participation
- Can't be a banking game

Major Gaming Cases

Knight v. Mississippi: Bingo is not a lottery.
 State legislature may legalize Bingo (casinos).

 Harris v. Missouri Gaming Commission: Bingo is a lottery. State legislature may not legalize (Bingo) casinos.

The DoJ's Gift to the States


- DoJ took 2 extreme positions re: Wire Act
- Applies to all gambling
 Applies if wire crosses thru another state
 Now DoJ backed off on both, mainly that Wire Act is limited to sports bets

The DoJ's Gift to the States

- Must be legal under state law
- Some state lotteries can act fast, with traditional games, & maybe poker
- State legislatures may authorize intrastate, inter-state & international
- Only limits: PASPA, Compact provision of US Constitution

Lotteries Around the World

- Some like Portugal and Michigan enforce anti-gambling laws • Almost all take sports bets • Almost all sell tickets online Canadian provincial lotteries run Internet poker & casino games
- VLTs and Internet games = clash with casinos
